My hope is that with the growing numbers and experience gained by the promoters, that this festival will be considered as a future location for our Clan Ramsay Annual Gathering.


If you are in the North Texas or South Oklahoma region, I hope you can join us next year in Sherman.

Kriston is the daughter of Clan Ramsay members, Chris and Penny Ramsey from Sevierville, Tennessee, and is a graduate of the University of Tennessee with a master's degree from Lincoln Memorial University and is a school guidance counselor for Knox County Schools. Greetings Members of Clan Ramsay International,



My wife Marie-Christine and I had the honor of being invited as representatives of Clan Ramsay by the Scottish Baron Michel Pilette de Kinnear in this traditional Scottish activity Burns organized at the Cercle Royal Gaulois Artistique et Littéraire in Brussels for its members.

The circle is located in the heart of the Royal Park of Brussels. Private, it brings together ambassadors, representatives of the liberal professions, scientists, magistrates and lawyers, university professors and academicians, politicians, executives or business leaders, artists and people of letters.

They happily meet there for lunch, attend an activity organized by the Circle or take advantage of the magnificent setting.

The Circle was founded in 1847 by personalities from the Belgian world to serve as a place for friendly, intellectual, artistic, literary, humorous, gastronomic, tourist and even sporting meetings. Refinement and conviviality are the two major characteristics of these events, marked by the spirit and exceptional setting of the Cercle salons, the oldest of which were built in 1780.

The meal was sumptuous. The menu included salmon with garnishes as a starter, followed by haggis and potato mousseline, grilled lamb rump steak with candied garlic flageolet puree, and an apple and caramel tartlet with vanilla ice cream.

The evening's entertainment was masterful with a superb traditional speech at the Haggis. Harpist Inge Frimout accompanied us with her beautiful voice and her sweet melodies on the harp. A demonstration of Scottish dances was given to us by the Caledonian society. Magnificent tunes were played by the Hay Pipe Band and ultimately the Auld Land Syne.

The evening ended in the lounges of this famous club where liqueurs were offered to us.

Europe Scottish Clans Burns

February 1, 2025

Our clans met as part of the Scottish Clans Days in Edegem at the De Basiliek hotel to celebrate the traditional Burns Night. It is one of Scotland's most famous celebrations, paying tribute to the life and work of Scotland's national poet Robert Burns. It is an event that fills our members with joy to come together and share a traditional Scottish meal, music and dance through the poetry of Robert Burns.

The Ayrshire poet and lyricist died in 1796, at the age of 37, but he is still regarded as the most prominent poet to have written in the Scots dialect. His most well-known poems include To a Mouse, Address to a Haggis, Tam O'Shanter, A Red, Red Rose and The Selkirk Grace.

The Haggis ceremony, a traditional dish made of sheep heart, liver and lungs mixed with oat-



meal and spices, is at the heart of our reunion.

Why do we eat haggis on Burns Night?

The reason we eat haggis on Burns Night is probably down to the man himself, Robert Burns. During his lifetime, haggis would have been a very nutritious and inexpensive meal to prepare for poor families.

In one of his most famous poems – his “Speech to a Haggis” – Burns humorously celebrates his love of the humble delicacy.

“Congratulations on your honest face as a son,
Great leader of the pudding race!
Take your place,
Bread, tripe or thairm:
You are also good
than my airm.”


In this first stanza, Burns crowns haggis as the “chief of the pudding race” and tells him that his place is above all others.

This is how “Mister Haggis” paraded through the room to the sound of bagpipes. A member of the Scottish group of Celtic musicians “The Hoggies” delivered the address to the Haggis. The guests then shared the meal: salmon carpaccio, arugula, Haggis - neeps and tatties, whiskey and brown meat sauce, Tiramisu with Baileys sauce, Mocha and cookies.

The evening continued with the “ceilidh”. Ceilidh is the traditional Scottish festival which includes music and dancing. The word “ceilidh” comes from the Scottish Gaelic céilidh, meaning “gathering” or “feast”.

The evening ended in a joyful atmosphere with the famous Auld Lang Syne sung by everyone, clinging to the fraternal chain.

Discovering the Caledonian Canal: A Hidden Gem in the Scottish Highlands

Nestled within the rugged beauty of the Scottish Highlands, the Caledonian Canal is an engineering marvel that often slips under the radar of visitors captivated by the region's towering peaks and legendary lochs. On July 19, 2024, while enjoying a lunch of fish and chips at Fort Augustus—complete with a delightful discovery of Taylors Haggis & Cracked Black Pepper crisps—I found myself enchanted by this waterway's understated charm. Stretching 60 miles from Inverness to Corpach near Fort William, the canal connects Scotland's east and west coasts, weaving through the dramatic Great Glen and linking Loch Ness, Loch Oich, Loch Lochy, and Loch Dochfour with 29 meticulously crafted locks.



Constructed in the early 19th century by the renowned Scottish engineer Thomas Telford, the canal was originally designed to provide a safer passage for ships avoiding the treacherous northern seas. Today, it's a haven for boaters, cyclists, and walkers, yet many tourists bypass it, drawn instead to the mystique of Loch Ness or the majesty of Ben Nevis. At Fort Augustus, where I savored my Highland-inspired snack, the canal's locks come alive with activity as boats glide through, offering a serene contrast to the bustling tourist trails nearby.

What makes the Caledonian Canal special is its blend of natural beauty and human ingenuity—only a third of its length is man-made, with the rest carved by nature's hand. It's a peaceful retreat often missed by those rushing through the Highlands' more famous landmarks. Next time you're in the region, pause at Fort Augustus, grab a bag of those uniquely Scottish crisps, and watch the locks in action—you'll uncover a Highland treasure hiding in plain sight.



March Book Review

The Traitor of Arnhem by Robert Verkaik

There's nothing particularly Scottish about it, but this book is all about a WWII British-run operation with the code name of Market Garden and the British and Dutch spies that played the primary role in the defeat of the allies at the Battle of Arnhem in Holland shortly after the D Day invasion June 6, 1944.

While the book seems a little slow at first, the twist and turns of roles of the spies will keep you interested. The review provided by Amazon, below, is better than the one I could write. I thoroughly enjoyed the book and if you have any interest in the WWII European Theater of War, you will enjoy this book.

The dramatic story of a betrayal that changed the course of World War II—the never-before-revealed role of the Cambridge Spies in the devastating Allied defeat at the Battle of Arnhem.

The end of World War II is in sight.


Following the overwhelming victory on D-Day, Churchill, Roosevelt, and Stalin all seek to shape the future to their own ends by winning the race to Berlin.

The British launch Operation Market Garden, the greatest airborne operation the world has ever seen. It is a bold roll of the dice that, if successful, will end the war in weeks. But behind the scenes spies are working their craft, the Allies' plans are betrayed, the operation fails—and thousands of our soldiers die.

The Traitor of Arnhem tells the never-before-told story of this famed operation and of the spies working to cause the catastrophic defeat. One traitor is a terrifying giant of a man, a supposed hero of the resistance who sends hundreds of fellow freedom fighters to torture and death; the other is an aristocrat and an English gentleman, working from inside the heart of the Allied war effort in London. Both of them are working for the Russians.

Drawn from newly released archives and shedding fresh light on the spies responsible for its failure, The Traitor of Arnhem is the remarkable account of the battle that would transform the conclusion of the European campaign and the start of the Cold War.

Clan Ramsay DNA Project Update

Our 4th Quarter 2024 free kit recipient, David Thomas Ramsay, in Lanarkshire, Scotland, received his results from Family Tree DNA, and we now know his haplogroup. He is a member of R-M269, which is the most common Ramsay/Ramsey haplogroup in Scotland. He is distantly related to many Clan Ramsay members.

While he does not yet closely match many others at this time, we were able to put him in touch with a very close genetic match who also lives in Scotland, and the two are comparing family trees and hope to find common ancestors.

We are still looking for candidates for the 1st Quarter 2025 free kit, and I will be taking a kit to the Sherman Celtic Festival in Sherman, TX. If a good candidate is found, I will ask that person to submit the sample. If we do not find a good candidate this quarter, we will continue to receive requests and will award two kits next quarter.

My own haplogroup has been very successful at recruiting sample donors, and we continue to learn more about this E-V22 haplogroup. Our free kit giveaways are for Y-DNA tests, for which only males may provide samples, but we have had success with female Clan members who can locate a male descendant of their Ramsay/Ramsey ancestor.

An example of this is with member Julie Kroening, whose cousin Skip (Henry) was selected as our 3rd Quarter recipient. Last newsletter, Skip had submitted his sample and was identified as E haplogroup. His kit was upgraded to the Big Y test, but the results were not yet available at that time.

Based upon initial results, Skip appeared to be closest to Mark B. Ramsey of NY. With the Big Y, however, we now know that he is most closely related to Nathan Ramsay, our 1st free kit recipient. Nathan had also been thought to be close to Mark, but we now know that while they are all related to the same ancestor back in Scotland in the 1600s, Skip and Nathan are related to Mark (and me) likely around the time of that ancestor in Scotland, but not more recently.

DNA, while the data remains constant, continually reveals more information with each test result. More and more recent mutations are identified as new testers match older ones. This is why the old method of not testing other members of previously tested lines is flawed. We have found several members of previously assumed close family, who turn out to be not related for a thousand years.

Another DNA test that is common, but does not directly reveal paternal lines, is the autosomal test. This is the type test many people have taken from ancestry.com, 23&me, etc. This test compares markers from both sides of the family and can help identify cousins back up to 5 generations in the past.

Autosomal DNA does not help much with paternal lines directly, but, a close match between a male Ramsay/Ramsey, and a female who has a male Ramsay/Ramsey who can be persuaded to submit a Y-DNA sample, can be very helpful. I personally have found three male Ramsey family members through their daughters this way. If you have taken an autosomal test, try to find matches who have a male Ramsay/Ramsey that might be willing to submit a Y-DNA sample, to match your family line with others of the same haplogroup, and find common ancestors.

Last newsletter, I reported on additional testing companies I am exploring. My results from LivingDNA were very similar to those I received from Family Tree DNA and Ancestry.com. I found the results to be less detailed than Family Tree DNA with paternal lines, but very similar to the others with autosomal matches. The only advantage that might eventually be realized will be with UK matches, as they are more concentrat-



ed in that region. I don't think they are as useful to USA testers at this time but might be in the future.

For finding matches to Ramsay/Ramsey ancestors, I have yet to find better results than with Family Tree DNA. If you are interested in submitting a DNA sample with them, there is a sale going on through the end of March, with the best prices available during the year. For example, the basic 37 marker test for paternal research is \$79 through March 31, normally \$119.

Use these promo codes at checkout, if you order a test. Let me know if you need any help.
